ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES TEACHERS IN SCHOOL HEALTH PROGRAMMES

- 1. Familiarisation with the Student Health Card.
- 2. Preparation of students for health checkup and immunizations.
- Observation of students for defects and deviations from normal health (physical, emotional and social ...)
- Observation of Students for their posture, personal cleanliness, eating, study, health and play habits.
- 5. Filling up the columns as indicated in the Health Card.
- Opening a new Card for every child who enters the School for admission in the first standard.
- 7. Screening of vision and hearing and taking height, weight, chest measurements and other particulars of school children.
- 8. Co-operation with the Medical Officer and the Health staff concerned with the School Health Services and assisting them while conducting health check up of pupils. (working as a member of the Team).
- Providing simple treatment for minor illnesses and first aid in emergencies using the contents of the medical kit supplied to the school.
- 10. Bring to the notice of the Headmaster / Headmisterss and parents when a child is found seriously ill.
- 11. Informing the local health staff or the Medical Officer of the PHC if any student is seen to be suffering from any communicable disease.
- 12. Treatment of pupils and in case of referrals entering follow up action in the relevant pages of the Student Health Card.
- 13. Devising and implementing activity oriented health education to school children and promoting healthful practices among them.
- 14. Organising child health activities, exhibitions, school gardens.
- 15. Working as a member of the team Medical Officer, Nurse, and other teachers and community members.
