. - 1. The Supreme Court in its judgement dated 23rd February, 1990 in the Writ Petitions No. 8307-11/83- Dharwad District Public Works Department Literate Daily Wage Employees Association and others, vs, State of Karnataka, laid down a scheme for regular-sing the services of the daily wage employees who had been appointed in the various departments of Government on or before 1st July 1984. Pursuent to the said judgement, orders were issued in G. O. No DPAR 2 SLC 90. dated 6th August 1990. The said G.O., among other things, prescribes the modalities for regularisation of the services of the eligible cails wage employees. -Subsequently, recessary clarifications and -modifications were issued in the O.M./G. Og/Circulars read at (2) to (11) above. However, considering the fact that many representation - are still being received from the daily wage employees serving in the vari- us departments of Government regarding delays and anomalies in the implementation of these policy directives. Government decided to constitute & High Level Ufficial Committee consisting of the following members, to examine these representations and make specific recommendations to Government for their fair and expeditious disposal.

Member-Secretary The Committee which was constituted as per G. O. No. DPAR 2 BLC 95, dated 2. 14-7-1995 is in the process of finalising its report.

3. In the mean time based on the information furnished by the various departments in response to Government letter No. DPAR 839 BRC 95, dated 18-1-1995 the semmittee has found that as of now, out of 47, 676 daily wage employees eligible to be regularized as per the said G.O. dated 6-8-1990 read with the subsequent clarification/instructions, where are still 6251 eligible daily wage employees serving in the various departments of Government, whose services are yet to be regularised. The Committee has therefore made certain pecific interim recommendations in order to expedite the process of regularising the services of these 6251 eligible daily wage employees appointed on or before 1-7-1984. Hence the following order.

GOVERNMENT OFDER No DPAR 2 SLC 95, BANGALOBY, DATED 2320 NOTENEDR 1995.

4. The process of regularising the services of the remaining daily wage employees who were appointed on or before 1_7-1984 and are eligible for regularisation as par the said Government Order dated 6-S-1990 and clarifications/instructions subsequently issaed in the circulars etc. read at (i) to (11) above, shall be carried out at 3 levels vis., at the District level, Divisional level and the State level respectively, as per the following procedure,-

(1) At the District level .-

At the District level there shall be a Committee with the following members: (1) Deputy Commissioner of the District (2) Chief E-Icutive Officer of the Zilla Panchayat Chairman

This Committee shall perform the following functions :-

(a) It sha'l obtain from the district-level officers of department concerned in the district, the list of daily wage employees who were appointed ou or before 1st July 1984 and whose services can be regularised in accordance with the GO. No. DPAR 2 SLC 90, dated 6th August 1990 and the subsequent clarifications/instructions issued by Government from time to time in the O. M./G. Os/Circulars read at (1) to (11) above.

C.

- (b) It shall first identify the sanctioned vacant posts in the respective departments in which such eligible doily wage employees are working and against which their services can be regularised.
- (c) In case no such vacant sanctioned posts are available in the department in which the duily wage employees are working, it shall identify suitable vacant sanctioned posts in the other departments at the District level against which the services of such eligible daily wage employees can be regularised and assign them to such departments.
- (d) Consequent upon such assignment by the Committee, the Appointing Authority concerned in the department, to which they are assigned, shall usage specific orders regularising the service of the eligible daily wage employees so assigned and appointing them to the respective sanctioned posts.
- (e) In case a sufficient number of vacancies in sanctioned posts are not available in any of the Departments of that district. the Deputy Commissioner shall send proposals to the Divisional Commissioner of the revenue division concerned for assigning the unaccomadated eligible daily wage employees to departments having vacancies in other districts of that division.
- (f) This Committee will send copies of its proceedings to the Divisional Commissioners, Heads of the Departments, Joint Secretary, Finance Department (Services) and Deputy Secretary, DP & AR (Service Rules) and district level Officers of the concerned departments in the district.
- -(g) Consequent upon the assignment, it will be the reponsibility of the Appointing Authority concerned to ensure that the orders of appointment are issued expeditionaly and copies of the same are sent to the Head of the Department, Divisional Commissioner, Joint Secretary, Finance Department (Services) and Deputy Secretary, DP and AR (Service Bales), Vidhana Soudha, Bangalors-500091 and others concerned.
 - (2) At the Divisional level :-

The Divisional Commissioner, on receipt. of proposals from the Deputy Commissioner, shall examine the possibility of assigning the daily wage employees to the various departments having similar vacancies in the other districts of his division and wherever such vacancies exist, he shall assign them accordingly. Consequently, the Appointing Authority concrede shall take action as per items (d) and (g) above. In case a sufficient number of such vacant posts are not available in the division, the Divisional Commissioner shall contact his counterparts in the other divisions for assigning the unaccomodated eligible daily wage employees to departments having vacancies in the other divisions of the State. Even thereafter, if they still remain unaccomodated, the Divisional Commissioner shall send preposals directly to the Secterary to Government of the Administrative Department concerned seeking creation of supernumerary posts to the extent required.

(3) At the State level:-

- (a) In respect of eligible daily wage employees whose services are to be regularised at State level, the Secretary to Government or the Head of the Department concraed, as the case may be, shall perform the functions similar to those assigned to the district level committees, matatis mutandis, wherever required.
- - (i) The Creation of supernumerary posts shall be resorted to only if no vacant superioned posts are available for regularisation. It shall be created by Administrative Secretaries for a period of 3 months only from the data of

- (ii) A Supernumerary post shall stand abolished as soon as the Government servant for whom it has been created vacates it on account of retirement or confirmation in another regular permanent post or for any other reason and so officiating arrangement should be made against such post:
- (iii) the supernumurary post is personal to the Government Servant for whom it is created and no other Government Servent can be appointed against such a post:
- (iv) The Secretaries to the Government shall maintain a register of the supernumerary posts created in various departments coming under three administrative control in pursuance of this order. The register shall contain the particulars of the individuals who hold lien against them and the progressive abolition of such posts as and when the holders of the posts ratice or get absorbed in regular permanent post for the parpose of verification of service pension and also for the purpose of absorption of Monthly ratel establishment workers in regular service in the department;
- (v) The expenditure involved in this connection shall be met out of the budget allocations of the departments concerned and no additional grant shall be sanctioned for this purpose;
- (iv) As a result of creation of the above supernumerary posts equal number of posts held by the Daily rated/monthly rated workers shall get abolished and orders of creation and abolition of supernumerary posts shall be issued simultaneosly in the same Government Order;
- (vii) The department should ensure that these monthly rated employees/Daily wage employees shall be regularised strictly in terms of G.O. Dated 6th August 1990 and strictly against the group/post to which thay were initially appointed on daily wages and not with reference to subsequent change in groups/ posts held by them on the basis of qualification or acquisition of qualification during the tenure of Daily Wages/MRE. as on the date of absorption into regular establishment except to the extent modified in O.M. No. DPAR 27 SLC 91, dated 2nd January 1992. G.O No. DPAR 27 SLC 91, dated 20th January 1992, Circular-No. DPAR 7 SLC 92, dated 27th June 1992 and G.O. No. DPAR 17 SLC 94, dated 20th October 1994.
- (viii) The aforesaid delegation of power relating to creation of suprenumerary posts shall be available only for the period until all the Daily Wage employees in the State, appeinted prior to or on 1st July 1984 are regularised. The power so delegated shall be strictly confined, for the purpose of this Government order only.
- (c) Before the expiry of the carrency of these supernumerary posts. DP1R (Service Rules) will examine the possibility of assigning the excess remaining eligible daily wage employees, if vacancies are available, from one division to another and or from one department to another within the State as a whole failing which it will take steps to suitably extend the supernumerary appointments of unaccommodated daily wage employees, with the concurrence of Finance Department.

5. The district level officer of the department concerned/Divisional Commissioners/ Heads of the Departments and Secretaries to Government, as the case may be, should ensure that the number of daily wage employees whose services are to be regularised ride above does not exceed the numbers indicated in column 3 of the statement appended as Appendix-II.

- 6. Time Limits:
 - a) The District Level Committee shall complete the entire exercise assigned to it vide this order before 31st December 1995.

Preamble:

In the Government Order dated:14.11.1995 read at SL No.1 above the Karnataka Health System Development Project and the Karnataka Secondary Level Hospitals Development Projects have been approved. The Project proposal as approved by the World Bank envisages, creation of Additional 4221 permanent posts for the 250 hospitals covered by the Project funded by the World Bank and KFW, and also 841 Additional posts to strengthen the Directorate and for manning the Engineering and Equipment maintenance wings of the projects.

In Govt. Order dt.31-5-97 read at (2) above, sanction has been accorded for creation of additional 4221 permanent posts to man the 250 Hospitals covered by the Projects funded by the World Bank and KFW. Out of which 30 posts of Lay Secretaries, 73 posts of Office. Superintendents and 35 posts of Senior Assistants/First Division Assistants are among other different posts created . But it is envisaged in the Karnataka Health System Development Project proposal approved by the World Bank that 67 posts of Lay Secretaries , 36 posts of Office Superintendents and 35 posts of Senior Assistants are to be sanctioned. For the above sanctioned posts, the places are not indicated in previous Govt. order and now the decision has been taken to identify the places for the above sanctioned posts keeping in mind the proposal as in the project document. In the circumstances explained above, now it is decided to issue orders identifying the Places for 30 posts of Lay Secretaries only, 36 posts of Office Superintendents and 35 posts of First Division Assistants . For the remaining posts of Lay secretaries & Office Superintendents, separate order will be issued. Hence the following order issues.

In the supply order read at (1) above vehicles were provided to District Surgeons, District Surveillance Centres and to Taluka Medical Officers under Karnataka Health Systems Development Project. The Taluka Medical Officers of Sub-Divisional Head Quarters have not been provided the vehicle under this project as these officers are functioning as Additional District Health Officers with the facility of a vehicle for discharging their duties. All the vehicles now provided are diesel vehicles. Shortly, the equipment maintenance centres will also be provided diesel vehicles. It is found necessary to fix a uniform amount as fuel charge and maintenance charges. Considering the jurisdiction of officers using the vehicles such a proposal was placed before the Steering Committee Meeting held on 13.1.97 proposing the charges to be fixed. The Steering Committee approved the proposal. accordingly the following orders.

Under the circumstances explained in the preamble, Government are pleased to sanction fuel and maintenance charges to the users of vehicles provided under the Karnataka Health Systems Development Project as detailed below considering the jurisdiction of the officers using the vehicle.

PREAMBLE: -

Government in their order read at (1) above, created the District Development Fund&constituted District Level Health Systems Committee in all the Districts allowing retention of user Charges. The Administrative Medical Officers of the Secondary Hospitals are empowered to collect the user charges specified by the Government from eligible persons and credit the same in the Bank Account opened in the name of the District Health Committee. The District Health Committee may allot such funds back to the hospital where it was collected for improving the facilities in the hospital. Accordingly Bank accounts are opened in all the 20 Districts and funds are being credited in to them.

However Vanivilas Hospital, Bangalore, Chigateri Hospital, Davanagere and Cheluvamba Hospital, Mysore could not implement the Government Orders since they function under the Directorate of Medical Education. The Department of Botony, Bangalore University gave a proposal for Rs.6,51,680/- for taking up this study The Steering Committe in its 16th meeting held on 29th April, 1997 approved the proposal of entrusting the said to the Department of Botony of Bangalore at a cost of Rg.5.50 lakhs. Accordingly, sanction was accorded for taking up the Study on Microbial Contamination in Hospitals by the Department of Botony of the Bangalore University at a cost of Rs.5.50 lakhs.

The Department of Botony, Bangalore University vide its letter cited at ref.(2) above, stated that the sudy will have to be taken up in accordance with the guidilines issued by WHO and on this basis the proposal had been given for Rs.6,51,680/-. It has been further stated with the reducted cost of the proposal at Rs.5.50 lakhs, it will not be possible to conduct the study and requested to increase the cost to Rs.6.50 lakhs. The World Bank was, addressed vide D.O. letter cited at ref.(3) to accord clearance to increase the cost of the study from Rs.5.50 lakhs to Rs.6.50 lakhs. The World Bank vide its letter cited at ref.4) above has since accorded clearance for the proposal.

In partial modification of Official Memorandum dated 23-6-1997, sanction is accorded for entrusting the study on Microbial Contamination in Mospital at a cost of Rs.6,50,000/- (Rupees lakhs and fifty thousand) only to the Department of Botony, Bangalore University. All the terms and conditions enumarated in O.M. dated 28-6-1997 shall remain unchanged. The advance already paid shall adjusted in the final claims.

Sub:- Implementation of Yellow Card Scheme for the year 1998-99 Read:- Proceedings of the Steering committee Meeting held on 23-5-1998.

Preamble :

· . f :

Improving access to SC / ST population in rural Karnataka for existing health facilities is one of the components under KHSDP. The Government of Karnataka developed a scheme popularly known as Yellow Card Scheme to implement this objective. The scheme consists of extending health facilities to the SC / ST population through annual health check-up camps held in all the subcentres of the state. In Government order No. HFW 16 CGM 95 dated 07-10-95 sanction was accorded to introduce Yellow Card System initially in Mysore, Kolar, Bijapur, Raichur and Hassan districts for the benefit of Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes at an estimated cost of Rs. 1.5 crores.

The Steering Committee approved an operationalisation plan to extend the yellow card scheme to all the districts of the State in its meeting held on 16-06-97 at an estimated cost of Rs. 5.41 Crores and was sanctioned in G.O. No. HFW (PR) 439 WBA 97 Dt. 25-07-97. Accordingly, the scheme was launched in all the remaining 15 districts in Aug. - Sept. '97 after district level workshops were held to train the medical officers of district and taluka levels. The programme was put into operation for only 3-4 months as it was suspended at the end of January '98 on account of ensuing parliamentary elections. Approximately, 6 lakh SC / ST population have been benefited from the scheme so far. Drugs, laboratory chemicals and yellow cards were procured and distributed to the districts. Districts were also given funds to meet operational expenses such as for POL, honorarium for LMOs, camp arrangements, stationary and training. A total amount of Rs. 89,89,637/- was spent for drugs, while the expenditure on laboratory chemicals was Rs. 9,38,000/-. Sixteen lakhs Yellow Cards were distributed which at a cost of Rs. 16,10,000/-. The districts spent Rs. 6,90,497/- for POL, honorarium for LMOs, training and other contingencies. As the scheme worked for only 4 months and due to other constraints only Rs. 1,12,28,134/- could be utilised during the year.

The programme has restarted in all the districts from May '98. While the basic operationalisation plan remains the same, the action plan for the year 1998-99 proposes a number of additional activities spread throughout the year which will ensure a better performance in all the districts. Completion of organization at taluka and subcentre levels, training of all categories of workers, involvement of Anganwadis, MSS members, village leaders and NGOs, IEC activities, district level monitoring by designated officers of the Health and Family Welfare Department are activities which are emphasized. The yellow card requirement for the districts will be completely met with and the required drugs and laboratory chemicals will be purchased as per procurement plan drawn up for the purpose. As all the taluka medical officers have been with vehicles, they can monitor yellow card activities in a better way to ensure total implementation.

The overall budget requirement is same as for the previous year but some items need enhancement. Rupees 7.5 million is required for the purchase of laboratory chemicals and reagents for this year. As the requirement for stationary on account of reporting and incidental expenses in the camps will increase, the contingency amount has been increased to Rs. 4 million. Provision for other items such as drugs, vehicle hire and POL, Honorarium for LMOs, Training, IEC and Yellow Card remain unchanged. However, the district-wise allocation of money for drugs, laboratory chemicals and yellow card have been revised and more realistic as the estimates are based on the SC / ST population of the districts. Similarly, the estimates for POL, honorarium for LMO, training, IEC and contingency have been revised based on the

number of sub centers. The total budget required for Yellow Card implementation for the year 1998-99 is Rs. 61.75 millions.

The action plan for the implementation of Yellow Card Scheme for the year 1998-99 at an estimated cost of Rs. 67.75 million was approved by the Steering Committee in its meeting held on 23-05-98. Hence the following order.

ORDER NO.HFW(PR) 439 WBA 97 Bangalore Dated 27-07-1998.

In the circumstances explained in the preamble, sanction is accorded to incur an expenditure of Rs. 6,17,50,000/- (Rupees Six crores seventeen lakhs fifty thousand only) for implementation of Yellow Card Scheme during the year 1998-99 as detailed in the Annexure-I appended to this Order.

The expenditure on this behalf shall be debitable to the Head of Account as detailed in the Annexure-II appended to this Order.

This order issues with the approval of the Steering Committee at its meeting held on 23-05-1998 and the approval of the Project Administrator, KHSDP & E/O Additional Secretary to Government, Health & F.W. Department.

In O.M. dt. 28-6-97 read at Sl. No. (1) above, sanction was accorded for the entrustment of studies relating to Microbial Contamination in hospitals through the Department of Botany, Bangalore University, Bangalore at an estimated cost of Rs. 5,50,000/- (Rupees Five lakhs fifty thousand) only.

Accordingly an agreement was also entered into vide SI. No. (2), Appendix B therefore which specify funding agency to release entire cost of equipment grant (Rs. 1,20,000/-) and 60% of remaining amount of total outlay of Rs. 5,50,000/-. There is no mention of the mode of final payment. However, in O.M. dt. 3-7-98 read at SI. No. (3) above, the cost of study has been enhanced to Rs. 6,50,000/-.

No. (5) above, Dr. Somashekar, Department of Environment Science, Bangalore University has stated that out of total outlay of the studies, Rs. 6,50,000/- an amount of Rs. 5.28 has been released and a balance of Rs. 1.22 lakhs is required to be released. He has further stated that research work has to be kept going, which needs funds, in the interest of the above work an amount of 10 to 15% of the balance amount Rs. 1.22 lakhs be retained by the Project Authorities till the final report is submitted and the remaining amount may be released, immediately. The request of Dr. Somashekar has been examined in details.

Sanction is therefore accorded for the release of Rs. 1,03,700/- (Rupees One lakh three thousand seven hundred) only being 85% of Rs. 1.22 lakhs to be paid and retain 15% of the said amount i.e. Rs. 18,300/- till the University submits final report along with the utilisation certificate for entire amount.

Whereas the draft of the Karnetaka Health and Family Welfare and Medical Services (Medical and Paramedical: Staff) (Special Recruitment) Rules, 1998 was published as required by sub-section (2) of section-3 of the Karnataka State; Civil Services Act, 1978 (Karnataka Act 14 of 1990) in Notification No.DPAR 2 SRD 98, dated 23rd May 1998 in part 4 section 2-c(i) of Karnataka Gazette (Extra-Ordinary) dated 25th May 1998 inviting objections and suggestions from all persons likely to be affected thereby within 30 days from the date of its publication in the Official

And whereas, the said Gazette was made available to the public on 25th May 1998.

Gazette.

And whereas, no objections and suggestions have been received by the Government.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section-3 read with section-8 of the Karnataka State Civil Services Act, 1978 (Karnataka Act-14 of 1990) the Government of Karnataka hereby makes the following rules, namely:-

1. Title, Commencement and Application:- 1)These rules may be called the Karnataka Health and Family Welfare and Medical Services (Medical and Paramedical Staff) (Special Recruitment) Rules, 1998.

2) They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

3) Notwithstanding anything contrary contained in the Karnataka Directorate of Health and Family Welfere Services (Recruitment) Rules, 1965, the Karnataka Public Health Services (Recruitment) Rules, 1960 and the Karnataka Medical Department Services (Recruitment) Rules, 1960 or any other rules made or deemed to have been made under Karnataka State Civil Services Act, 1978 (Karnataka Act 14 of 1990), the provisions of these rules shall apply to direct recruitment vacancies of the categories of posts of Health and Family Welfare Service or Karnataka Medical Service as specified in the schedule.

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Provided that, nothing in these rules shall apply to more than one recruitment.

2: Definitions:- (1) In these rules unless the context otherwise requires.

- (a) 'Committee' means the Selection Committee constituted under rule 4.
- (b) 'Qualifying Examination' means the examination leading to a degree or diploma certificate
- specified as minimum qualification for recruitment to the post specified in the schedule.
- (c) 'Schedule' means schedule appended to these rules.(d) 'Vacancies' end
- (d) 'Vacancies' means the vacancies in the categories of posts splicified in the Schedule to these rules.

(2) Other words and expressions used in these rules but not defined shall have the same meaning assigned to them in the Karnataka Civil Services (General Recruitment) Rules, 1977.

3. Age;- (1) Maximum age limit for recruitment under these rules, is respect of each category of posts shall be as specified in the schedule.

Provided that in respect of the category of posts where the age is not specified, the age limit shall be as specified in the Karnátaka Çivil Services (General Recruitment) Rules, 1977.

4. Mode of Recruitment:- (1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Karnataka Civil Services (General Recruitment) Rules, 1977 or rules of recruitment specially made for recruitment to the categories of posts specified in the schedule recruitment to vacancies specified under these rules shall be made by the State Level Selection Committee consisting of the following members:-

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1. Director, Health and Family WelfareChairman2. Director, Medical EducationMember

- 3. Director, Social Welfare or his Member
- representative
- 4. Director, Backward Classes and Minirities Member cr his representative
- 5. Chief Administrative Officer, Directorate Member of Health and Family Welfare Services Secretary

(2) The Committee shall for recruitment to the category
of posts specified in column (2) of the schedule cause to
invite applications from the candidates possessing qualifications specified in column (3) thereof by publishing in
more than one widely circulated Regional Newspapers of which one shall be in Kannada and in the Official Gazette.

5. List of selected Candidates:- (1) The Committee shall, from among the candidates who have applied in pursuance to the publication inviting applications under rule 4 prepare a list of candidates for each category of posts in the order of merit on the basis of percentage of total marks secured in the qualifying examination and taking into consideration the orders issued pelating to reservation of posts for the Schedule Castes/Schedule Tribes and other Backward Classes including reservation for women, and weightage to the candidates studied in rupal areas in accordance with the Karnataka Civil Services (General Recruitment) Rules, 1977.

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(2) If two or more candidates have secured equal percentage of total marks in the qualifying examination, the order of merit in respect of such candidates shall be fixed on the basis of their age, older in age being placed higher in the order of merit. The number of candidates to be included in such list of eligible candidates shall be equal to the total number of vacancies notified.

(3) The Selection committee shall also prepare an additional list of such of the candidates not included in the list prepared as per sub-rule (1) above. The number of candidates to be included in such list shall, as far as possible be twenty five percent of the number of vacancies notified.

(4) The lists prepared under sub-rtle (1) and (2) shall be published in the Official Gazette and shall be valid till all the vacancies specified under these rules are filled up.

6. Appointment of Candidates:- (1) Candidates whose names are included in the list prepared under rule 5 may be appointed by the appointing authority in the vacancies in the order in which their names are found in the list after satisfying itself. After such enquiry as it may consider necessary, that 65 ch of the candidates is suitable in all respects, for appointment.

(2) The inclusion of name of a candidate in the list published under rule 5 shall not confer any right of appointment.

7. Application of General Recruitment Rules:- Except in respect of matters for which provision is made in these rules, the provisions of the Karnataka State Civil Services (General Recruitment) Rules, 1977, for the time being in force, shall be applicable for purposes of Recruitment under these rules.

In the Government Order read at (1) above, sanction was accorded for entrustment of studies on Burden of Disease for Karnataka State to Administrative Staff College of India, Hyderabad at an estimated cost of Rs.2,70,000/- as approved by the Steering Committee in its Meeting held on 29.4.97. The Terms of Reference were sent to the World Bank for their No Objection. In response, the World Bank made certain observations on Terms of Reference. The main observation is that Burden of Disease study has already been undertaken for Karnataka State and there is no need for another study and if another study is required for Burden of Disease, it could be extended to district level. - To assess the quality and robustness of the data with reference to different data sources.

The recent research on several communicable diseases has emphasised the need to strengthen the institutional structure for surveillance and management of major communicable diseases. Under the KHSDP the Govt. of Karnataka will have to establish a effective surveillance system which aims at describing health events over time in a simple flexible, acceptable sensitive and accurate manner. The Project proposes to establish a comprehensive and effective surveillance system.

Currently there are District Health Laboratories in all 18 (Old) districts excepting Bangalore (Urban) and Bangalore (Rural). Further it is proposed to procure all the items as detailed in the Annexure in one package except Refrigerator i.e., Item No. 31 and to supply the items to all the 18 District Laboratory Officers through District Health & F W Officers of Tumkur, Kolar, Shimoga, Chitradurga, Bidar, Gulbarga, Bellary, Raichur, Belgaum, Dharwar, Karwar, Bijapur, Mandya, Mysore, Madikeri, Chikkamagalur, Hassan, Mangalore.

Preamble:

The Diesel generators of 62.5 KVA, 50 KVA, 15 KVA and 5 KVA were supplied to the project hospitals depending on the bed strength as contemplated in the project proposal. Now the Medical Officers of these hospitals have requested to release funds to buy diesel to run these diesel generators. It is considered necessary to release funds as requested to use the generators in the event of power failure. A proposal to release an amount of Rs.3000/- p.m. to these hospitals having 5 kVA generators, Rs.5000/- p.m. to the hospitals having 15 KVA generators and Rs.15000/- p.m. to the hospitals having 50 KVA and 62.5 KVA generators was placed before the Steering Committee meeting held on 19-12-98. Sub: Annual Maintenance of Hospitals taken over by Karnataka Health Systems Development Project from Public Works Department

The hospitals with more than 100 beds were with the Public Works Department for their maintenance. With the launching of Karnataka Health Systems Development Project, these hospitals were handed over by the Public Works Department to the Karnataka Health Systems Development Project for construction and renovation of the buildings. Still maintenance was done by the Public Works Department only. In some cases it was observed that there was overlapping in expenditure on these hospitals by the Public Works Department and the Karnataka Health Systems Development Project. Considering this problem, the subject was placed before the Project Governing Board in its meeting held on 30th October, 1998. The Project Governing Board in principle agreed for the proposal of taking over of all these 100 bed hospitals for maintenance by the Karnataka Health Systems Development Project from the Public Works Department. On the basis of this decision, the Chief Engineers in Public Works Department were directed by the Secretary, Public Works Department to hand over these buildings to the Karnataka Health Systems Development Project for maintenance also. Accordingly the Executive Engineers of the Karnataka Health Systems Development Project have been directed to take over these buildings by following the required procedures.

Regarding the modalities of maintenance of these hospitals, the proposal was placed before the Steering Committee in its meeting held 19th December, 1998. The Steering Committee has given its approval for maintenance of these hospitals by placing an Assistant Engineer/Junior Engineer in-charge of one or two buildings depending on the availability of Assistant Engineers/Junior Engineers. The Steering Committee also agreed for the proposal of releasing an amount of Rs. 500/- per hospital to each Section Officer at a time for maintenance of these hospital buildings by the Executive Engineers concerned. The amount required for maintenance of hospital buildings will be released to the respective engineers in the form of LOC from the project under the Head of Account "2210-01-110-83". The Executive Engineers shall release this amount to the respective Section Officers.

The Section Officers will draw this amount of Rs. 500/- at a time for each hospital and will carry out the following maintenance works.

- 1. Replacement of Bulbs and Tubes
- 2. Rectification of Tap connections

- 3. Replacement of broken window panes
- 4. Rectification of drainage
- 5. Providing ceiling plastering upto a limit of 50 sq.ft.
- 6. Providing additional electric connections upto a limit of 100 ft.
- 7. Replacement of switches and providing additional switches, etc.
- 8. Replacement of broken wash basins upto a limit of 2 per hospital
- 9. Replacement of roof tiles with a limit of Rs. 500/- per hospital
- Replacement of door hinges, window hinges and other fixtures upto a limit of Rs. 100/- per hospital
- 11. Cleaning of Water Tanks

12. Repairs to Sewer Lines and Inspection Chambers within a limit of Rs. 200/-.

The Section Officers, Assistant Executive Engineers and the Executive Engineers are hereby directed not to take up the following works with this amount for maintenance of hospitals without the specific approval by the Engineer-in-Chief, Karnataka Health Systems Development Project.

1. Rectification of leaking roofs

2. Any new civil construction or alterations

3. Cleaning of Septic Tanks

4. New road works

- 5. Maintenance of gardens
- 6. Civil works including painting, alteration, sewage system, electrical system where the cost is more than Rs. 200/- in each case.

If the Section Officer feels that the above works are of urgent nature and cannot wait till the renovation work is taken up under the project, he should make a specific proposal with proper justification and submit line estimates to the Executive Engineers. The Executive Engineer in turn will take the approval of the Engineer-in-Chief before taking up such works.

The Section Officer will open a Register for each hospital to make necessary entries regarding the maintenance works taken up for that hospital. The format to be used for maintenance of such Register is enclosed herewith as Annexure - I. The Section Officer on the request of the concerned Superintendent of the hospital/Administrative Medical Officer will make necessary entries in the Register and carry out the works either with the amount available with him or by taking necessary sanctions as indicated above. The concerned Superintendent or Administrative Medical Officer of the hospital will check the work done by the Section Officer and make necessary entries in the Register. This Register should be made available to any of the inspecting or higher authorities visiting the hospital for their inspection and if the inspecting authority desires to make any comments or give his opinion, he can do so in the same Register.

This Circular is issued in terms of the decision of the Project Governing Board dated 30^{th} October, 1998 and the decision of the Steering Committee dated 19^{th} December, 1998.
