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MAINLY FOR PARENTS AND TEACHERS

In many countries people have bad eyes and teeth because they do not know how to look after them properly. Children should understand the importance of caring for their own eyes and teeth. They should become familiar with some simple rules of hygiene.

This book is a story about two old men who did not care for their eyes and teeth properly, and how a teacher in a local school used their stories as a basis for teaching her class about the good care of eyes and teeth.

Hello! My name is Peter. In my town live two funny men. One is called Mr Eye-Patch. The other is called Mr Gummy. Mr Eye-Patch can only see with one eye. Mr Gummy has no teeth in his mouth. We laughed at them a lot.

"They <u>are</u> funny!" we said. We do not laugh now.



Sometimes we put things in the road. We put them in front of Mr Eye-Patch. He did not always see them. He fell over in the road. We laughed at him and ran away.

Mr Eye-Patch plays football with us. He does not always see the ball. He can't see at all with one eye. He sometimes falls over the ball. We laughed at him once.

"He is funny!" we said.

We do not laugh now.



Mr Gummy can't eat very well. He can't eat hard food because he has no teeth. He can't eat meat or nuts. He can only eat soft food.

Sometimes we gave him a hard sweet. We said: "Here is a soft sweet for you."

Mr Gummy tried to eat it. We laughed at him.

"He <u>is</u> funny!" we said.

We do not laugh now.



One day Mr Eye-Patch fell over the ball. He hit his head on the ground. We all laughed. Our teacher saw us. She was not pleased with us. She said: "You all have good eyes and teeth. Mr Eye-Patch and Mr Gummy do not. You must not laugh at them. It is not good to laugh at people."

Then she said: "We will play a game. Come here,
Peter." She put a cloth over my eye. Then she asked:
"Can you see, Peter?"

"I can only see with one eye," I answered. "I'm like Mr Eye-Patch:"



"Walk round the room," she told me. I went round the room. I hit a desk. I hit a chair. I didn't fall over because our teacher held me.

THE STORY OF MR EYE-PATCH

One day Mr Eye-Patch came to school. He came to tell us his sad story.

He said: "Hello! I am Mr Eye-Patch. I was once a small boy like you. I liked to read. I liked to read books in the house. My mother said: "Don't read your books in the dark. Sit by the light. You must have a good light to read." Sometimes I read in the dark.



My mother gave me a lot of vegetables and fruit to eat. Green and orange vegetables help your eyes. Orange and yellow fruit are good, too, I didn't like green vegetables. Sometimes I gave them to the goat. I liked to play in the village with my friends. One day we played in the road. Something went into my eye. It hurt. My big sister tried to get it out with her finger. Her finger was dirty.



That night my eye hurt. In the morning it hurt more. My eye didn't open. My mother looked at my eye. She washed it with some cold water. Then she went to work and I went out to play.

That evening my eye hurt very much. It was very bad. I went to bed, but I didn't sleep.

In the morning my eye did not open. My mother looked at it. It was very bad. It hurt me a lot. My mother said to my big sister: "Take your brother to the nurse. I must go to work."

She said: "Take this medicine. Put some in the eye every morning and every evening."




My big sister and I went home. We went to play with our friends.

Then Mr Eye-Patch said; "Always look after your eyes. You don't want to be like me, do you?"


Our teacher said: "Thank you, Mr Eye-Patch.

Don't put things in your eyes. Never put dirty fingers in them. Dirty fingers make our eyes bad.

Tell your mother when something goes in your eye. She will wash it with clean water. Tell your mother when your eye hurts. She will take you to the nurse. She will make your eye better. But you must help her. Mr Eye-Patch forgot about the medicine. Never forget about the medicine.



Then our teacher asked: "How can we help your little brothers and sisters? How can we find out about their eyes?"

We can play games with them. We can show them things. First we hold the things near their eyes. We ask: "What is this?" Then we hold the things a long way away. We ask: "What is this?"

We can ask: "Do your eyes hurt?"

We can look for children with bad eyes. We can help them.

Our teacher said: "Let's play these games now.

Then you can play them with your little brothers and sisters."

We all got up. We asked each other: "Can you see this?" "What is this?" It was a very good game.

"Brush your teeth every day."


We forgot to brush our teeth. We forgot to wash our mouths. We ate sweets as we played in the road.



My mother went to work all day. My big brother and sister looked after us.


My mother said to my big brother: "Please help me. Make brushing sticks for the children."

Then my new teeth came. They were all bad because my old teeth were bad. They hurt a lot.




My mother saw my teeth. She said: "They are all bad because you never brush your teeth. You eat too many sweets. You drink too many sweet drinks.

The Nurse said: "Come and see the dentist."


The Dentist said: "I am going to take your bad

Our teacher thanked Mr Gummy. Then she talked to us about good teeth. She talked about our little brothers and sisters. "How can we help them?" she asked.




"We can make them a brushing stick," she said.

Then she said: "Put salt on your brushing stick. Or you can use cold ashes."


She showed us how to do it. We got some salt. We put the brushing stick in some water. Then we put the brushing stick in the salt.

Brush your teeth before you go to bed."




Then our teacher said: "Look! I have some teeth."

Don't give them a lot of sweets.


Don't give them a lot of sweet drinks.

- 8 Be Mr Gummy. Walk round the room. Talk like Mr. Gummy. Speak his words.

 Now be Mr Eve-Patch. Do the same.
