Unfortunately, I am NOT sure whether I will be able to access my mail from 9th till 22nd. SO if there is any of you who could finalise the report, I would prefer that. Please volunteer

(Unfortunately, I am leaving for Nagaland (North eastern parts of India) on Monday evening for a Quaker Peace Mission. Government of India last week lifted the ban on one of the strongest and oldest militant outfits in India. Nationalist Socialist Council of Nagaland, paving way for direct talks between the top leaders of the Guerrilla outfit and the Prime Minister. This sounds like a big step forward looking at the fact that Nagaland has been one of the oldest and fiercest militancy spots in India.

Quakers have been facilitating peace talks and I was part of the mission they undertook last year. A cease fire has been in place for the last 22 months, something unprecedented in the history of the region. Sounds like only positive signals in troubled times. I hope you are watching the Norwegian brokered peace talks between the SriLankan government and tamil tigers that sounds like equally promising.

Greetings from Jana Swasthya Abhiyan (PHM India) and Asian Social Forum!

Let me first apologise for not being active on this circle -- largely as a result of our preoccupation with the Asian Social forum.

I think it would be useful for this circle to also know a bit about the Asian Social Forum that is being organised in Hyderabad, India between January 2-7, 2003. The Asian Social Forum is part of the WSF process and is an attempt by the WSF process to reach out directly to different parts of the World. You would have already heard of the tremendous response to the European Social Forum in Florence, held last month. The PHM WSF circle, I would suggest, should attempt to link up with these Regional Forums and not limit its engagement to the WSF in Porto allegre as the former are now seen as integral components of the WSF process.

We are expecting about 10-15,000 delegates from across Asia to participate in the forum. In addition to eight large Conferences (4-5,000 people each) there are already 300 other events (seminars and workshops) registered for the forum. For those who are interested details are available at: www.wsfindia.org.

The Social sector Conference will include a major focus on Health and is scheduled for the 3rd of January.

This is in response to the protest letter by Malachi Orondo Kenya PHM National Coordinator circulated in the PHA-exchange and the responses of Vandana and Unnikrishnan that followed.

1. I am sure all PHM members will be unanimous in their denunciation of violence anywhere in the world - terrorism or conflict related and the incident in Kenya is no exception.
2. We share the grief, shock and concern of all our brothers and sisters in Kenya and I request all of you to write to Malachi about this as early as possible.
3. However I would like to point out that all PHM participants and their organisations do not automatically become responsible for violence / terrorist or otherwise carried out in the name of some other group in their country and it is important that we do not fall into this simplistic trap-blaming, peace loving PHM members for the violence their fellow countrymen may promote. UPMRC did not claim responsibility for the bombing nor is there much they can do to prevent it except denouncing the route of violence which they have always done.
4. We need to work towards a violence and terrorism free world collectively but always keeping a clarity between those who perpetrate violence in any country and the peace loving citizens of the same country.
5. All Indians or even all Gujaratis do not automatically become responsible for what a few did in Gujarat recently. But all of us are responsible to do something about it and to prevent the recurrence of such meaningless violence.
6. Let us re read the section of PHM Charter on war, violence, conflict





Dear Friends,

This is my second communication to you all since I took over. I propose to send one every fortnightly at least so that we all begin to work more closely together and the momentum of PHM begins to catch up with all our ideas and hopes for PHM in the years to come.

1. The Asia Social Forum: Over 14426 people from all over India and Asia (780) gathered from 2nd to 7th January 2003 to celebrate that 'Another World is possible - Another Asia is Possible', through 8 conferences, 60 seminars, 164 workshops and cultural programmes and street events and exhibition and stalls. PHM was well represented not only from India (many states) but 19 PHM delegates from Bangladesh lead by Nouman; Niranjana from Sri Lanka; Antonio Tujan from Philippines and others joined in. The PHM Bangladesh circle released their Activity report (January - December 2002) - Health March from Savar to Hyderabad. The Contact Special issue on PHM was released. PHM delegates chaired and participated in various sessions - Zafarullah and Antonio Tujan (Social infrastructure conference including health); Niranjana, Qasem, Ravi (War, Conflict and Disaster workshop); Zafarullah and Nouman (Right to Health Care workshop) and Qasem, Prem, Hari, Mira, Sumathi, Nouman, Tisa Vitarana, Niranjana, Ravi, Thelma, Abhay and others (in Alma Ata Anniversary workshop). A special workshop entitled 'Taking the PHM forward' was also held where we got feedback and suggestions from all levels of PHM constituents from grassroots health workers up to country coordinator. The Alma Ata web signature campaign was launched on 5th January with a press conference at which Qasem, Ravi, Mira, Sumathi, Prem, Sundar and Binayak were present. CHAI ran a bookstall that facilitated PHM publications from all over India; the PHM secretariat; Hesperian Foundation etc. Finally a press release from ASF - by PHW was made on 7th January. PHM was well represented and we enjoyed the collectivity and solidarity of movements, networks and concerns that were Asian and global.

2. The Funding Group Meeting: Qasem and Prem spent a whole day at CIIC Bangalore on 7th January after ASF Hyderabad to discuss the plan of action, budget estimates and other important related issues. Andy, Maria and Olle, the other 3 members of the funding group were unable to join due to prior commitments. The pre final budget estimates and notes around a plan of action for 2003 have now been circulated to the funding group for finalizing and follow up.

3. Zafarullah's visit: Zafarullah visited the PHM Secretariat on 8th to discuss various PHM and non-PHM collaboration with CHC. He agreed to my suggestion that GK Savar should continue to be a PHM resource centre even after the secretariat moves. They can continue to publish the news brief, the new publications of PHM and the reprints and also facilitate meetings or training programmes at the PHM center at GK. We also explored some creative means of raising the funds that PHM owes GK which was explained to us by Qasem at the Steering Committee meeting.

4. Olle Nordberg's visit: Olle was to visit us on 15th and 16th January as a follow up to the funding group meeting on his way home from Myanmar but this has now been postponed to 20th and 21st of February.

5. The Steering Committee Meeting Minutes: Unni and Andrew have put together a 33(!) page report of the

steering group meeting at Vik Savar, which Maria and I have been reviewing. I am sending it to all of you in 3 installments sections so that you can peruse it rapidly and send me any corrections / additions within a week of receiving each of them. They are a very comprehensive documentation of all our discussions and give a good sense of all our ideas and evolving processes and initiatives. Please do respond as soon as possible so that we could circulate (a further edited version on the PHM exchange fairly soon).

6. The Alma Ata Anniversary initiatives:

- a) The web signature campaign is launched and seems to be picking up. Please visit it at www.TheMillionSignatureCampaign.org and not only sign up if you have not already done so but please begin to get others to do it in your region/county/city/organizations and use/promote/announce it in all your meetings / programmes.
- b) The work on the film is just beginning (more news from Unni and Sathya on this after the World Social Forum event)
- c) The short position paper from David Sanders is still awaited.
- d) A more detailed note in all our suggestions will be posted on the exchange soon to set the ball rolling in all our constituents networks and countries.

7. The World Social Forum: Maria has posted details of the preparation for PHM presence and involvement in WSF. 19 people will be representing us at the forum's. And news from more who are attending is coming in. WGNRR will be there: also Nadine Gasman from Mexico: others....

We look forward to their strong presence and involvement.

8. Finally as the War on Iraq seems to be imminent lets all join Mike Rowson and Medact in their petition to Tony Blair to stop the war and the UN petition against the war. These have been forwarded to you all.

DECLARATION OF THE II INTERNATIONAL FORUM FOR THE DEFENSE OF PEOPLES HEALTH

Health is a human right and a fundamental part of the right to life, as well as the duty of the state and its obligation to fulfill international commitments. Health is a right in and of itself, and not a means to promote so-called human capital. Nor can it be seen as merchandise, but rather a public good.

Health is an integral process that includes everything from decent living conditions, healthy employment with adequate conditions, access to basic services such as clean water, education to promote citizenship, adequate food, to a healthy environment free from violence, and accessible quality health care at all levels.

Health workers play a fundamental role in facilitating the right to health and access to adequate services. Thus, it is important that they have adequate working conditions.

We denounce the serious and sustained deterioration of living, health and working conditions of the majority of countries and peoples. This is found particularly in poor countries, but also in some other countries the social right to health is being lost (Great Britain, Germany, etc.). This deterioration originates in the concept that health and life are merchandise and sources of wealth and speculation, and in the prevailing model of care that is extremely costly and promotes dependency.

Migration from the countryside to the city and from poor countries to less poor countries is a daily component of the lives of our peoples, and in many places, it is one of the main sources of income for families and for countries through family remittances (It is the primary source in Ecuador, El Salvador, the Dominican Republic, Nicaragua, etc.). This has resulted in broken families and the loss of labor, social and citizen rights by those who emigrate and become outcasts in the new countries.

This phenomenon is used to justify and legitimize the privatization of services, along with, among others, arguments about the inefficiency of public administration, limited public resources and weaknesses in the systems themselves.

The neoliberal so-called "reforms" and "modernization" of the health sector – which are only a whitewash for privatization – deepen inequality and lack of access. There are several kinds of privatization: one is giving services to private providers and insurance companies, and the other is imposing a commercial mentality in the public sector. Both are detrimental to the right to health. However, democratic methods are being experimented in some places, such as Brazil, to seek ways to improve services, participation and citizen control; these have had some successes as well as difficulties.

We must break the neoliberal dogmas that say, for example: provision of services cannot be separated from the financing of those services, nor can one separate the different levels of care.

The IMF, World Bank and regional banks like IDB impose these concepts as conditions for countries to access their services. This generates inequality, less access and worsened living and health conditions.

At the same time, we should note the lack of belligerence on the part of the WHO to safeguard the health of peoples and its subordination to these conditions, the WTO and transnational corporations.

We support decentralization as a means to deepen and develop democracy, but also acknowledge that it is not sufficient in and of itself. It must take place in the framework of

national, state and local public systems, because these local systems cannot take over the responsibility of national governments. Incomplete decentralization creates obstacles to access and increased inequity.

The wars promoted against Iraq by the government of the United States and the United Kingdom, or that of the Israeli government, its occupation, systematic destruction and attempt to eradicate the idea of nation and nationality of the Palestinian people, threaten the right to life and health of these peoples and of the world.

The same is true of the coup attempts and efforts to de-legitimize the legal government in Venezuela, and the ongoing war in Colombia. Both types of conflict seek to legitimize a hegemony that threatens the autonomy and self-determination of peoples, all in order to defend the "freedom" of financial capital.

We underscore the situation in Argentina, where the application of the IMF dictates has already led to the impoverishment and epidemic spread of hunger. But, we also want to note that the levels of social and popular resistance have made it possible to limit the implementation of IMF policies.

We salute the enormous and ongoing social and popular demonstrations against the war in Iraq, the war against the Palestinian people, the resistance to privatization of services, the FTAA, the WTO and its dictates and the "free" trade agreements. And we make a call to sustain and multiply these actions.

The II International Forum for the Defense of Peoples Rights has been one more step in the process to articulate resistance, common positions, and unification of efforts to change these concepts and promote actions with new forms of struggle and relations with governments, institutions and civil society organizations. It has allowed us to renew our energy and commitment. A campaign has been launched here seeking **A MILLION SIGNATURES FOR HEALTH NOW**, to demand fulfillment by governments and the WHO of the Alma Ata Declaration 25 years ago, by means of which they committed to provide Health for All in the year 2000.

Due to all of the above, we believe it is absolutely necessary to develop a process to build proposals and exchanges that come from the communities and grassroots organizations, move to the municipal, state, national and international levels, and conclude in the **II Assembly and I World Forum for Peoples Health in July 2004**, that will allow for drawing conclusions, building new proposals and allowing for concrete joint actions at all levels. We therefore call on all organizations, individuals and institutions who are committed to health and welfare to join this effort, organize your own activities, spread the word, join efforts and make real our dream of **HEALTH FOR ALL NOW**.

A Consultation on TRIPS and Pharmaceuticals in Colombo was organised by HALAP, TWN and Health Ministry, Sri Lanka coordinated by Dr. Bala.

It was recognised that many national governments are being pressurized (subtly and not so subtly) bilaterally and multilaterally to formulate their National Patent Legislations which are not in the interest of their people of their own country. Cecilia and Martin of TWN had presented its model - National Patent Laws.

There was a suggestion to try to get it printed and released at World Health Assembly.

TWN is trying to get it ready in time. If this is released at the NGO Forum or at a special event it would be very nice. TWN is the member of Coordinating Committee of PHA represented by Evelyn Hong. I had promised to facilitate it.

TWN representative will definitely be present at PHM. Definitely Cecilia will be there. Since the time is short I am writing directly. PHM, Geneva may need to figure this out.

In view of the attempt to dilute the Doha declaration, the urgency as National Legislations on Patents are being formalized -- release of the Manual must be ensured.

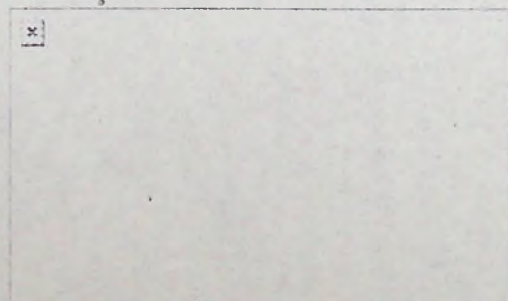

We are on the verge of completing the first draft of a 3-year plan based on some ideas that some of you sent in response to our three communications in July and some guesses and estimates we made through more indirect methods of communication. We shall send this to you all soon.

the meanwhile, this is a very important and practical communication, which we would like you all to take seriously and respond as soon as you can.

The issue before us is as follows:

1. The Iran Alma Ata Anniversary meeting which was proposed to be held between 16th – 21st September, has now been postponed to October 2003 (dates still being explored). They have even suggested December as another option.

We had hoped that from among the up to 50 invitees from PHM background (originally planned to be invited) Steering group members and secretariat support group members would be given first preference, since it is time we had a full steering group meeting as well with all plans for WSF, Health Forum (January 2004) and PHA – II, July 2004, beginning to evolve and hence the urgency.

- iii. 25th – 26th October – AIFO Bi-Annual Conference in Rome (3 PHM invitees receive Human Rights Award on behalf of PHM)
- iv. 26th – 29th October – Canadian Conference on International Health. Ottawa, IPHC and WEMOS are organizing workshops on Right to Health Care and Public Private Partnership.

I think at this juncture, a steering group / WSF / PHA – II planning meeting is more important than the Alma Ata Anniversary. So one option seems to be is to get Sunil to arrange a two day full-fledged steering group meeting, 22nd – 24th in Rome, just before the AIFO conference on the premise that Rome may be easier to reach for everyone rather than PHM Secretariat in Bangalore or GK Saver (Bangladesh) or even Teheran – Iran. Sunil has found a potential venue for 35 – 40 Euros a day (full boarding and lodging and 8km from Rome Airport to meet without urban distractions). We have to confirm by the 20th of August!

Some could stay on for AIFO Annual conference and join the PHM 3-member invited team to get the Human Rights Award on 25th / 26th

Finally while you all making this discussion, I am desperately trying to raise resources for travel - at present only around 20000\$ and that too not yet in PHM Account).

To help with the decision, can each of you immediately answer these questions?

- i. Can you attend any PHM related meeting, 20th - 24th October?
- ii. Is Teheran or Rome more convenient from where you will be in October?
- iii. In either case, what would it cost for you to reach Teheran or Rome from wherever you will be on 19th 20th?

(give both estimates - cheapest apex fares or other bargain fares to help with the final decision)

- iv. Can you raise this money from your own institutional resources/ grants?

If not, Can you advance this money in case PHM - Secretariat has not yet raised enough by then?

Please reply urgently with any other helpful suggestions.

The point we made was that when there is a regional process of identifying leaders and representatives for PHM India, India, Sweden, etc., then it is for PHM to decide who should represent the region and not PHM Steering group. Also if everyone who has helped the movement contribute on the steering group, it is not with enthusiasm, energy, and strong desire will block progress. In the movement leadership from the region, there is a very nice person, but an individualism does not co-exist with the PHM community. Even her PHM work is not shared with other people in India, Honduras and others know this well. The principle involved in the suggestion has to be understood and not interpreted as a tool against any particular individual. We are talking about representation and co-management not contribution. Greetings from the PHM Global Secretariat and the WHO – WHA Circle. This communication is the first announcement of some evolving PHM strategy for the World Health Assembly – May 2004. It follows a lot of informal communications that have been going on between many of us and the PHM Geneva group.

1. The World Health Assembly will take place from 17th to 24th May 2004 at Geneva. The programme and agenda is evolving and can be tracked on the WHO website www.who.int.
2. This year we suggest that the PHM team at WHA will be a small team making a qualitative input into specific agenda concerns and following up on initiatives. Also since we do not have as yet a grant to support PHM participation – the team will consist of only those who already have been invited to meetings or events around the WHA or can raise their own resources from their networks or regional efforts.
3. The PHM evolving agenda could consist of all or most of the following:
 - a. The WHO Policy on NGOs
 - b. The WHO Statement on Primary Health Care Policy (post Alma Ata Anniversary)
 - c. The Draft Diet strategy
 - d. Follow up on Infant and Child feeding.
 - e. Follow up on PHM – WHO Dialogue on 3x5 initiative, which was initiated at IHF – WSF and response to 3x5 programme presentation at WHA.
 - f. Feedback on Millennium Development Goals and concerns regarding restructuring of International health policies around them.
 - g. Links with HAI and MSF around the Access to Drugs Campaign
 - h. Reflection on WHO Task Force to promote Health Systems Research and pre-Mexico Summit Consultations
 - i. Invitation to PHM Secretariat coordinator to be part of the new Commission on Social Determinants of Health (This is the Poverty and Health Commission complementary to CMH that we have been advocating for)
 - j. Reflections / interactive discussion of PHM members and others on:
 - i. The critique of CMH report being presented in Sri Lanka (end April 2004 – Bala / Mike / Zafrullah etc working on draft)
 - ii. The People's Charter for HIV / AIDS – circulated by Unni for finalization

- iii. The GHW: Alternative World Health Report (hope someone from Medact team will make it)

- k. Informal follow up discussions with WHO leadership and resource persons – advocating the concerns of the People's Charter (Ravi is following up on ongoing efforts)

4. PHM Potential Team

As of now, those who have indicated ability to join the input / initiative are the following

- i) Maria Hamlin Zuniga (Nicaragua), who is a member of the sub-group working on WHO policy on NGOs, has confirmed presence at Geneva from 16th morning.
- ii) Sunil Deepak (Italy) has just confirmed his participation.
- iii) Dorothy Logie (UK) – who was earlier in charge of the AIDS circle, confirmed her participation.
- iv) Zafrullah Chowdhury (Bangladesh) will be present as Co-convenor of WHA circle and will follow up on the MDG Consultation, which he attended in Bangkok with Prem and others (He is on a working group formed at this meeting)
- v) Thelma Narayan (India), who is convenor of the PHM HIV – AIDS dialogue circle is in Netherlands in the previous week for a Gender Policy workshop and can make herself available to join discussions or specific events, if these are confirmed.
- iv) PHM Geneva Group: In addition, there will be active inputs from Nance Upham, Manoj Kurien (WCC), Lida Lhotska (IBFAN), Judith Richter and other local Geneva based PHM members.
- vi. I have been invited to be there as a follow up to work on Health Systems Research, the newly evolving commission on Social Determinants, and continuing dialogue with GFHR / COHRED and other groups.

5. Logistics:

I suggest that we will request Manoj Kurien of WCC to plan for an informal dialogue on 14th May at WCC for all those who can make it by then (2 – 5 pm) and on 15th and 16th May at John Knox, 2-5 pm for all those who can join in – as they arrive. Each confirmed participant will be requested to track one or more agenda at least from the website and report to the others, during these informal preliminary sessions on 14th / 16th May focussing specific concerns and strategy for advocacy.

6. Division of Labour (Additional Volunteers Welcome)

As of now I suggest the following:

Dear Ravi, Secretariat staff, and colleagues around the world,

Believe me I KNOW exactly what the secretariat staff is feeling. I know that silence and the uncertainty of knowing if everything is just lost in cyberspace. It is upsetting and disconcerting. And it brings frustration and, finally, it destroys motivation.

Undoubtedly we are all VERY busy, we are mostly ACTIVISTS. And we need to be in these troubled times. But, we can send a reply, if nothing more than "received". later we can get back with our comments and suggestions as "steerers". I also agree that we need to involve new people and new generation. What are we doing about that in each of our areas?

The volume: there is too much spam, junk, unsolicited mail etc blocking our servers and causing our mail boxes to overflow. As the moderator of several yahoo lists I must check the sites every 3 to 5 days and reactivate accounts. Most of the time the deactivation is the result of "over quota" in the mail boxes. I also get many reports of the "Server is too busy". Take the time to clean up and delete messages from your servers. That way the messages will continue to be delivered, at least.

Use a spam control. This has some disadvantages. I have discovered that the subject line with a RE: in it is recognized as spam on some computers. That is NOT good. So be careful with it.

There are many new viruses EVERY DAY. Be sure to have an up to date virus control. We use both Norton and Panda. You manage this with your computer technicians. If you do not have one, find one. We are getting lots of virus coming through PHM. Prasanna has taken security measures, but we all need to do something about it. Here at IPHC we are seriously considering moving to the Linux system. Do any of you use it? Let us know about your experiences.

Ravi, perhaps a weekly communication with several issues taken care of in one message would be more practical than many messages during the same week. Just a thought. Also, make the messages short, concise, and with definite points for reply or comment.

So, just some suggestions. Now, on with the work.
